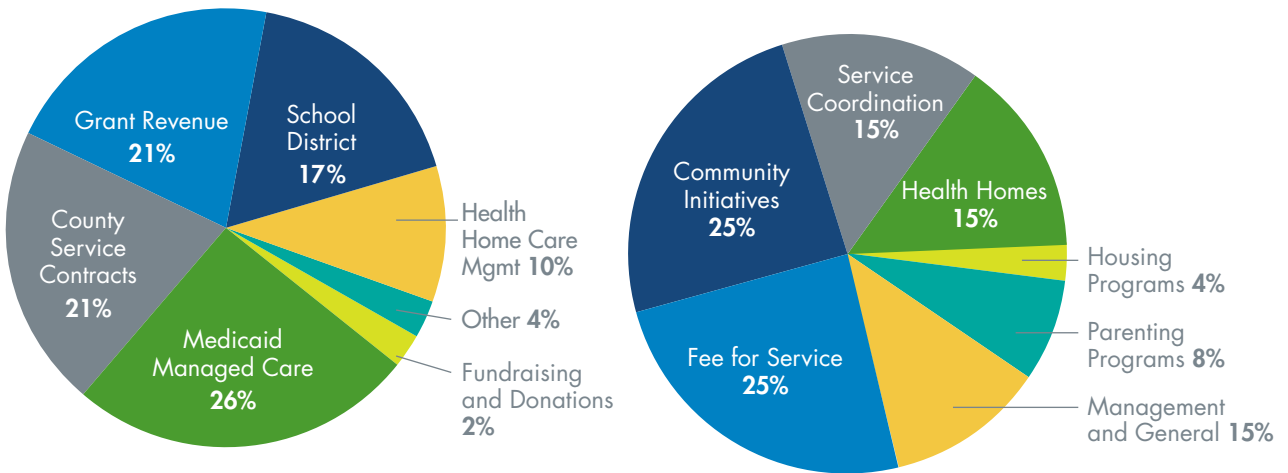

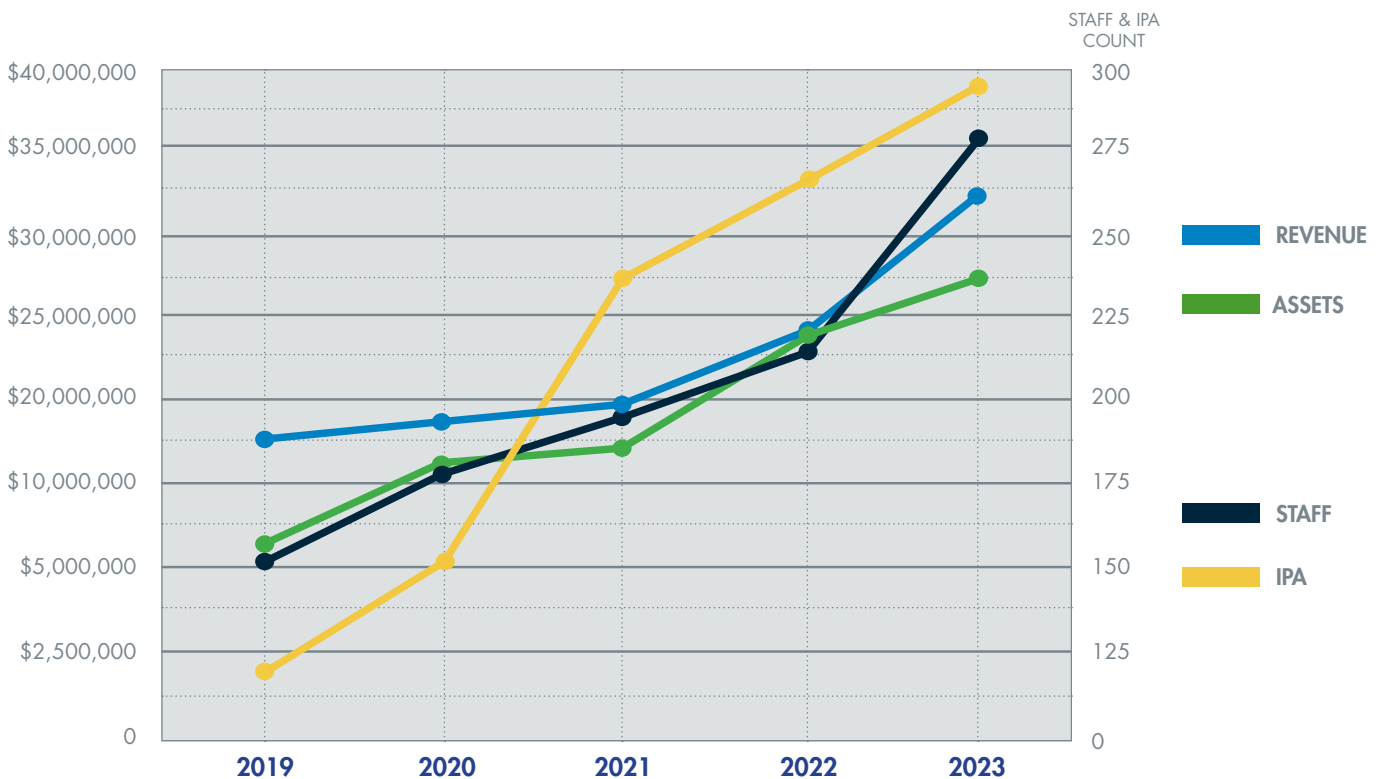

DEEPENING SUPPORT FOR UTICA'S *Students*

In September 2023, ICAN's Utica City School District System of Care kicked off in 13 schools across the city. An innovative model, it is designed to strengthen students' skills and learning to best support their educational journey and also support parents and guardians navigate community, school and home.

As an extension of the work that is being done in schools, we work in close partnership with the district, teachers, guidance counselors and school social workers to identify those students in need.

We build relationships and support students involved in high-risk behavior or are risk of engaging in such behaviors. "High-risk" has an ever-evolving definition. Students may lack strong outside supports, have truancy issues, and/or have behavioral or mental health challenges. We keep them from slipping through the cracks and remove barriers which are prohibiting them from being their best selves and reaching their full potential at school and at home.

Having ICAN right in the schools increases access and quickly can deliver services to help students, parents and school staff in any way needed to assure the success of students – one-on-one meetings, attendance in classrooms, facilitation session with/ between families and service providers, medication reviews, research-based assessments and much more. Our team also creates "beyond-school" recreational, educational and specialized programs rooted in self-care and empowerment.

SNUG COMPLETES *Year One*



SNUG completed a year of operation in Utica in 2023 with impressive numbers and impact. An evidence-based violence reduction initiative, SNUG prioritizes those who are most at risk of being impacted by gun violence. The Division of Criminal and Justice Services (DCJS) administers SNUG in 14 sites across New York State. SNUG responds to shootings to prevent retaliation through mediation of conflicts and disputes, mentors high-risk youth and connects them with job training, education and other opportunities, assists family members of those who have been injured or killed, organizes marches and other events to show the community's stand against violence and engages neighbors through events and projects.

CAMPAIGN RECEIVES STATEWIDE *Recognition*



ICAN was one of seven projects awarded funding from the New York State Office of Mental Health, all with the purpose of decreasing the negative stigma of mental health. Our marketing team created a multi-faceted campaign that included recruiting three Mental Health Ambassadors to share their stories, use their platforms, give advice to managing mental health, and spread the campaign message of "Everyone Has It. Every Day."

Print materials, social media, articles, radio spots and live radio appearances, swag like stickers, buttons and t-shirts, videos and more were created and the ambassadors also took that message on the road and visited schools and youth groups. Hundreds were reached in person and thousands were reached digitally. The campaign was featured in the statewide publication *Behavioral Health News* and will be showcased in a webinar in 2024. Phase two of the campaign will feature the return of our ambassadors and the recruitment of youth to work alongside them.

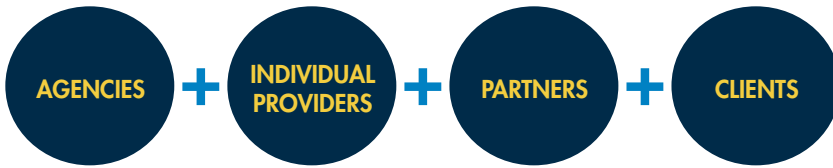

ELEVATE CNY
SPORTS COMPLEX

Opening in November 2022, Elevate CNY celebrated its first year of operation with great successes. With sports, athletes and mental health in the forefront of national conversations, this extension of ICAN is more important than ever!

Elevate CNY, powered by ICAN, hit the ground running and hosted a wide variety of sports leagues, skill-building camps, clinics, academies, summer and school break rec camps and special events in 2023.

The Vinny Maugeri Court was unveiled in November, opening up the opportunity for additional basketball, volleyball and pickleball programming. The Edwin J. Wadas Foundation supported the construction of the multi-purpose hard court surface along with the batting cages and other sports-related equipment to enhance Elevate's overall offerings and opportunities.

Along with the new court, the 60,000 square foot facility has two complete turf fields and also includes approximately 23 acres of land with walking trails

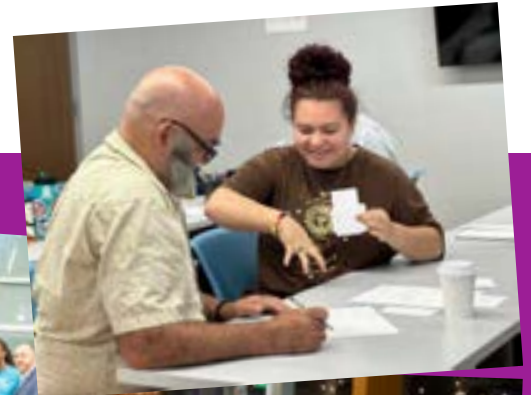
for future outdoor programming and opportunities. The indoor space is imperative for Central New York's four season climate and there is an increased demand for field time for teams and leagues in our area.

ICAN's acquisition of the building has allowed this community asset to remain operating for youth sports and recreation for all. With ICAN's expertise as a trusted human services agency focused on mental and behavioral health services, Elevate will also offer additional non-traditional programming for youth at the new facility. ICAN's Community Education and Training Program is able to integrate "beyond the sports" offerings such as leadership academies and training for coaches and teams, which compliments athletics perfectly.

Museum



Celebrating major milestones in 2023, the museum kept the fun going and readied the building, the brand and the team as it moved closer to announcing an opening date!

The 4,000 square foot rotunda addition was completed in September and the certificate of occupancy was granted the same month. The second floor space was finished as well and fabrication of all galleries is underway.

The museum continued to hold events, create programming and take the fun on the road across the Mohawk Valley. They held school break activities and their annual Mini Golf Classic along with the Worldwide Day of Play which welcomed over 325 visitors to the grounds of the new space. The popular 100 Plates. One Table. fundraiser was held in the new museum space for a one-time-only experience before the exhibits are installed. The Mobile Museum completed 42 visits greeting over 4,200 children and adults.

A highlight of the year, the new brand of the museum was created in a unique, innovative way to shine a light on creative workforce development and brought together local arts professionals and high school students. A collective co-creation of a dynamic logo and identity system was the result. In conjunction, an all-new website was launched.

EXPANDING SERVICES AND OUR FOCUS ON INCREASING IMPACT FOR

A Safe Haven for Children and Families in Crisis

Right now, children and families experiencing mental health crises in our region have nowhere to go except to the emergency room. ICAN's Children's Crisis Residence, set to open in 2024, will provide a safe, kid-friendly respite home to help children experiencing mental health crises recover, reunite with their family, and access the support they need to return home. Located at 2619 Genesee Street, the 3,800 square foot home has eight bedrooms for youth to stay in for up to 21 days at a time. During and after their stay, youth and their families will be connected to ICAN's wraparound services, ensuring that they have care needed at home to better respond to and prevent future crises.

A shift to the NYS 1115 Medicaid Waiver will reflect a more integrated and equitable approach to healthcare

The redesign will reflect a broader trend in healthcare towards addressing the root causes of health disparities. The waiver's focus on Social Determinants of Health recognizes that healthcare alone is not enough to improve outcomes - social factors must also be addressed.

Social Care Networks (SCNs) are cooperative regional networks that will provide screening and referral services. They are designed to connect healthcare providers with community-based organizations (CBOs) like ICAN that address the non-medical factors affecting health. These networks facilitate the coordination of services such as housing assistance, food security, transportation and employment support – all essential for improving overall well-being.

Access to Home-Based Crisis Intervention 24/7

In response to an increase in mental health crises among youth in our community, ICAN will launch the Child & Youth Home Based Crisis Intervention Project in 2024. Through this new initiative, ICAN will deploy highly trained Interventionists – who are available 24/7 – to deescalate and provide intensive crisis intervention to children at home, in school and in the community. Designed for youth ages 5-21, this project will significantly reduce the number of children and youth who experience the trauma of hospitalization or institutionalization. By providing high-quality, evidence-based services that are trauma-informed, youth guided, and culturally responsive, the Crisis Intervention Project will support youth and families in building the skills needed to prevent and intervene in future crises.

Opening of the Utica Children's Museum

The grand opening of the reimagined Utica Children's Museum – located in ICAN's Family Resource Center at 106 Memorial Parkway – is coming up in 2024. As the first children's museum in the nation to meet Universal Design Standards from concept through construction and completion, this 14,000 square foot state-of-the-art facility includes six new galleries which are reflective of the region and 60+ exhibits within – there will truly be something for everyone! We're excited to celebrate the museum's grand opening with the community and hope you'll join us!
